

Harmony Park

Oakview Road at East Lake Drive

At the center of Oakhurst lies Harmony Park, the heart of this community. The historic commercial district frames the park on three sides, and it is where concerts and pop-up events happen, where families enjoy treats, and where neighbors meet to share their news. In the middle of the park stands "Dreamsicle," by sculptor Nathan Pierce.

FASCINATING FACT: Oakhurst was incorporated as a city in 1910, and annexed by Decatur in 1916. Its commercial center was at W. College Avenue and East Lake Drive, where the East Lake MARTA station now stands.





Corner Slice

Detroit-style pizza is the star of the menu at Corner Slice. The rectangular pies are large and cheesy with a thick, pillowy crust. Enjoy a hot slice in the cozy dining room or at a sidewalk table outside. The pizzeria also serves crispy wings, salads, and sandwiches on house-baked bread.

LOCAL TIP: Order your Detroitstyle or bar pie with ricotta cheese, hot honey, and pepperoni for a next-level pizza experience.

This Oakhurst neighborhood favorite in a converted 1920s service station features a rotating list of Georgia craft beers and buzzworthy brews from across the nation. The menu offers pub fare – burgers, hot dogs, sandwiches and fried delights – and interesting salads and appetizers.

LOCAL TIP: Renovation of the space revealed painted advertising on what used to be an exterior brick wall. Give it a look.



Kavarna

This friendly little coffee shop has been a part of the neighborhood for more than a decade, offering up coffee and light fare, positive vibes, and sweets.

As a performance venue, it presents singer/songwriters, rock 'n roll, poetry slams, writers and lecturers, and off-the-wall performances you're not likely to hear anywhere else.

Authentic Mexican cuisine is prepared with a twist in a cozy storefront at the heart of Oakhurst. The menu features appetizers, salads, soups, quesadillas, tacos, enchiladas, and daily specials from the south of Mexico. And top-notch, hand-made margaritas – no mixes here!

LOCAL TIP: The patio (heated in the cooler months) features an amazing mural.



Mojo Pizza 'n' Pub

Oakhurst's neighborhood pizza joint since 1998, Mojo's serves New Yorkstyle pizza with a unique sesame-seed edge, as well as salads, sandwiches, pasta, wings, and more. The restaurant includes a full bar offering craft beer and cocktail specials, and full-service dining inside and out, with a dog-friendly patio at the heart of the action in Oakhurst, at Oakview and East Lake.

LOCAL TIP: Kids' meals are free on Tuesdays! (Dine-in only)

Every doughnut here is made completely from scratch. Doughs, glazes and fillings are all-natural, free of trans-fat, and made by people, not by machines. Revolution uses organic flour and quality ingredients like Callebaut chocolate, fresh seasonal fruit, and pure vanilla, and offers a variety of options for vegans and folks with sensitivities to gluten, eggs, or dairy. And while nothing goes better with doughnuts than coffee, there are also teas, cocoa, juices, and coolers, if you prefer.

LOCAL TIP: This shopping plaza is a one-stop shop for doughnuts, beer (Ale Yeah!), and pizza (Corner Slice), so it's popularly known as Homer Simpson plaza.

Open for dinner and for weekend brunch, Scout serves up a creative take on classic American cuisine and pours hand-crafted cocktails showcasing local and regional products. LOCAL TIP: When the weather is right, sip drinks on the large patio overlooking Harmony Park.

Fire Station No. 2

Decatur's second fire station was built in 1952 to provide fire protection on the south side of the railroad tracks. It was renovated in 2009, and includes a number of interesting architectural details. The building is LEED-certified silver, with numerous features to decrease its energy costs and offset its environmental impact.

LOCAL TIP: Note how the red "2" casts a red shadow and traverses the semi-transparent white panels on sunny days, working as a sundial.

Located in the Historic Scottish Rite, the Solarium is the site of weddings, parties, meetings, and other events, and serves as headquarters for Decatur's MLK Service Project.

Mead Road Mardi Gras Parade

Oakhurst Wine Crawl

Oakhurst Jazz Nights
